SUBJECT: JROTC Uniform Fitting and Issue Schedule

1. JROTC uniform issue schedule is shown below. The overall purpose of this program is to provide each JROTC cadet with a proper fitting and complete uniform prior to the beginning of the school year.

2. JROTC cadets are required to come to the JROTC Department on the scheduled uniform issue day as follows:

3. Returning cadets will perform the following:

A. Prior to scheduled fitting:

- (1) Inventory issued items: Belt, Buckle, Cap, Coat, Necktie, Shirt, Trousers, School Cord, and School Crest (1 each)
- (2) Ensure clothing fits: For those clothing items that are too small, bring in for exchange. (Note: COAT must be dry cleaned). Machine wash shirt, trousers do not have to be cleaned.
- (3) Any unserviceable clothing will also be exchanged at this time.

B. Upon arrival at school:

- (1) Bring only items that are to be exchanged. After exchange, clothing record will be updated and signed. Items requiring alteration will be at government expense.
- (2) For cadets that have no exchanges, after reporting at scheduled time, clothing record will be updated and signed.
- (3) Cadets reporting lost items will be charged for that item and item reissued.

4. New cadets will be issued a complete issue of military clothing. A BC haircut is required for proper fitting of military cap. Items requiring alterations will be at government expense.

5. It is the responsibility of each cadet to comply with the instructions provided in paragraphs 2 and 3 above. Failure to accomplish the scheduled fitting may result in disciplinary action. Cadets that cannot make the scheduled date/time will be rescheduled at registration. Issue takes place after school hours.

6. Those families with two or more cadets may bring all cadets on the day scheduled for the oldest cadet.

Thus far in 2011, dozens of Benedictine families and companies have re-directed a portion of their Georgia tax dollars to provide scholarships for eligible students to attend Benedictine. 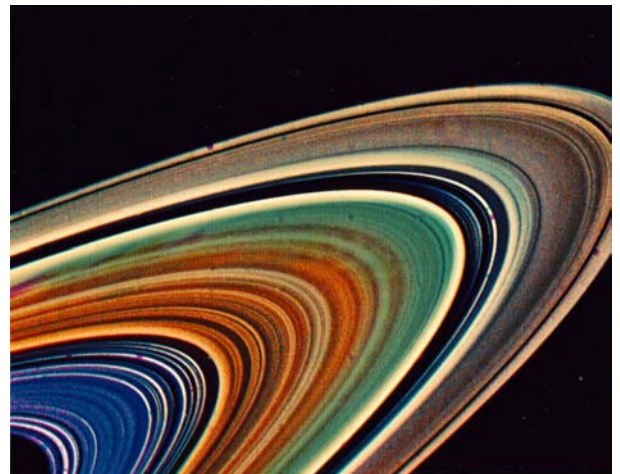

'SING A NEW SONG TO THE LORD'

At the beginning of a new school year educators and students are usually filled with mixed emotions. For the students, especially the freshmen students, the overwhelming feeling that they may be experiencing is fear. Questions may arise in their minds as to whether they can make it academically at BC or whether they will fit in and establish new friendships. What will their teachers be like is another concern that they might have. As far as the seniors go they may be somewhat anxious about whether they will be able to make it through the year and graduate in May. In addition to that most are probably wondering if they will be accepted into a college of their choice. New teachers (as well as veterans) likewise have some fears such as will they be able to handle the rambunctious young men that are about to present themselves before them for an education, and will they be successful in helping these young people grow in knowledge and maturity as persons who will be able to handle what the world has to offer.



Although fear can certainly be a motivating factor in our lives nevertheless it can also at times paralyze us. Jesus knew this very well. On one occasion he tells his disciples who were concerned about some issue, "Fear is useless, what is needed is trust (faith)." If we let fear dominate us we will not be able to function to our fullest and best capacity. When we place our trust in God we counter our fears and take control of our lives conducting them in a positive and fruitful manner. One of the ways to help us to control our fears is to become enthusiastic about something. Many times our enthusiasm for something will move us beyond our fear and cause us to take a risk that we would not otherwise have considered taking. This applies to many venues, be it the beginning of a school year, the first day at a new job, traveling a long way from home if we have never done it before or whatever. Something that I find interesting about the word 'enthusiasm' is that it comes from the Greek, "en, in + theos, god", which means to be possessed by a god, or inspired." This reminds me that Jesus gave us the gift of his Holy Spirit to inspire us and to give us courage, comfort and strength to deal with the challenges that life has to offer. The word 'inspire' means to 'breathe into.' Recall the time near the end of his life on this earth when Jesus was gathered with his apostles and after having breathed on them he said, "Receive the Holy Spirit, whose sins you forgive they are forgiven, whose sins you retain they are retained." Later on St. Paul would remind us that we are the 'temple of the Holy Spirit.' If the Holy Spirit dwells in us then we are filled with His gifts. It is these gifts which will help us through life and make us enthusiastic to try new things and to venture with confidence wherever the Spirit blows.

So as for myself, I'm getting excited about the coming school year here at Benedictine and I am looking for good things to happen. I am especially interested in seeing our students, parents, faculty, staff and administration become more well-rounded people who live each day with enthusiasm, with a zest for life, and who become more at peace and happier with their lives, and more thankful to God for giving them the gift of life in the first place. A good way to begin each day was taught to me by a priest-friend many years ago. He said that when you first wake up in the morning you should say to God, "What are YOU doing today that I can put myself in tune with?" If we are in tune with God as we go about our daily work then that can take a great burden off of our shoulders for we know that with God "all things are possible." Another excellent way to start the day (or end it) is to recite meditatively the well-known 23rd Psalm:

You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows.

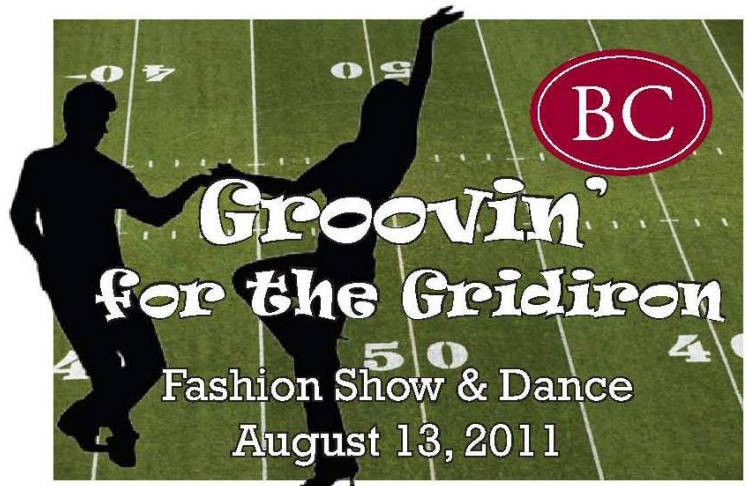

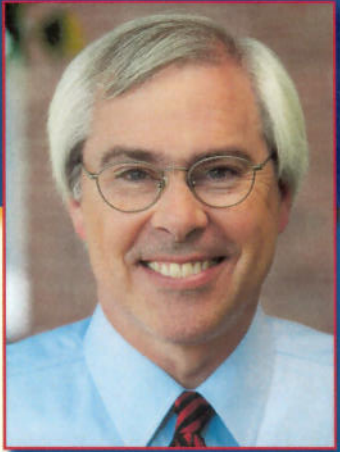
All for now. May God bless all of our BC family with a wonderful and fruitful new school year in which we all "Soar" to the heights. Amen.
